

Ligonier Township Supervisors
Minutes
8 March 2011

The Supervisors of Ligonier Township met in regular session at 7 pm with all three Supervisors present: William C Penrod Jr, Keith A Whipkey and Timothy R Komar.

From the audience Jan Milburn, Vickie Oles, Ed Oles, Elizabeth Donohoe, and Rosalyn Robitaille spoke on behalf of strong conditions being placed on gas drilling in the Township. Attorney John Smith is organizing a meeting of multiple municipalities interested in stopping the drilling until safer methods can be developed. Pat Spangler told Supervisors that drilling company people were on his property and doing damage. He was told to call the police if this occurs again.

A motion was made by Komar and seconded by Whipkey to approve minutes of the 8 February meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Komar and seconded by Penrod to approve the Treasurer's report for February. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Komar and seconded by Whipkey to pay the current bills. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Whipkey and seconded by Komar to table the Police Incident report until April. Motion carried.

Zoning Office – Cynthia J Turley

1. A motion was made by Whipkey and seconded by Komar to table a decision on the preliminary PRD application by Bethlen Communities pending receipt of a waiver of time to 30 April for a decision. Motion carried.
2. A motion was made by Whipkey and seconded by Komar to approve a subdivision for Roberta Adams in Oak Grove. Motion carried.
3. A motion was made by Komar and seconded by Whipkey to approve a subdivision for James Cunkleman on Giesey Road in Darlington. Motion carried.
4. A motion was made by Komar and seconded by Penrod to set the date 29 March at 6:30 pm for a public hearing for PJ Nied requesting a conditional use at Foxly Farms off Barron Road for a bread and breakfast. Motion carried.

Old business:

Supervisors announced that word has been received from the County informing the Township that the Community Block Grants announced last month are on hold pending passage of the Federal budget.

New business:

1. Spring dumpster day will be Saturday, 16 April from 8 am until noon.
2. Komar announced that the Township received a \$1,000 grant from the Workmen's Compensation providers for the Safety Committee to purchase additional safety equipment.
